#### **CO-CHAIRS**



Zachary Ritter, DPM

Dr. Ritter graduated with his Doctorate of Podiatric Medicine from the Temple University School of Podiatric Medicine in Philadelphia, PA and completed his residency at Saint Luke's Hospital & Health Network in Bethlehem, PA. He completed his fellowship at the Foot Disorder Research Academy in Rome, Italy in Reconstructive Surgery. He is the Chief, Division of Podiatric Surgery at UPMC Susquehanna and the Medical Director, Foot and Ankle Services at Bone and Joint Institute.

Dr. Ritter is certified by the American Board of Foot and Ankle Surgery in Foot Surgery and Reconstruction Rearfoot/Ankle Surgery, the American Board of Wound Management in Would Care and is a Fellow of the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgeons.



Mark Solomon, DPM, FACFAS

Dr. Solomon attended Rutgers College of Engineering and graduated Rutgers University in 1996. He graduated from the New York College of Podiatric Medicine as a member of the Pi Delta National Honor society in 2000. Afterwards, he was an intern at Weill- Cornell/ Wyckoff Heights and was the first chief resident to graduate the Morristown Medical Center foot and ankle surgical program. Dr Solomon founded Advanced Foot & Ankle Surgeons in 2003. In 2016, the practice merged with The Orthopedic Center and in 2019 became The Pediatric Orthopedic Center. As a partner, in 2018 he founded and became director of the ACFAS Pediatric Foot & Ankle Fellowship. In addition, he manages the foot & ankle and limb deformity service lines for the practice. The practice also hosts the only certified Ponsetti center in the state and a newly acquired spasticity clinic.

Dr Solomon is board certified by the American Board of Foot and Ankle Surgery and is a fellow of the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgeons. Since 2008, he has served as the podiatric consultant to the New York Jets. The last few years he has been a representative for ABFAS as an on-site residency program evaluator. Recently, Dr. Solomon has been appointed to the ACFAS Fellowship Committee. On a regular basis, he lectures on pediatric limb deformity, acute and gradual correction of the foot & ankle. In 2018, he was named as Physician of the year for the ARC of Morris County and named as a NJ Family top doctor. Dr. Solomon has two wonderful boys that keep his family very busy and he enjoys scuba diving, obstacle course racing and snow skiing.

### **FACULTY**



Adrienne Estes, DPM, MS, FACFAS, DAPM, FAPWHc

Dr. Adrienne Estes, DPM is a podiatric surgeon currently practicing in southern California. She is an Assistant Professor for Western University of Health Sciences and a practicing physician at Riverside University Health Systems. She graduated from WUCPM and after finishing her residency in NY at the HHC Hospitals she completed her fellowship at the North Jersey Foot & Ankle Fellowship under Dr. Michael Subik. She currently specializes in minimally invasive surgery, complex limb deformity correction, limb salvage, and surgical offloading solutions for diabetic ulcers. She is double board certified by the American Board of Podiatric Medicine and by the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgery. She is also a fellow of the Academy of Physicians in Wound Healing since 2016.

She is currently the site coordinator for the PGY3 residents from VA Loma Linda and leads the Foot & Ankle Grand Rounds at the RUHS Orthopedics Residency program. She was recently voted faculty of the year at WesternU and is currently advancing the medical school curriculum with surgical cadaver conferences for pre-clinical students. Kelsey Millonig, DPM, MPH, AACFAS

Dr. Kelsey Millonig is a fellowship trained foot and ankle surgeon practicing at East Village Foot and Ankle Surgeons in Des Moines, IA. Dr. Millonig received her Bachelor of Arts in Biology at Luther College in Decorah, IA where she earned honors as an All-American softball player and NCAA Woman of the Year. She completed her medical education at Des Moines University earning dual degrees in Doctor of Podiatric Medicine and Masters in Public Health. As a medical student, she was selected as the first podiatric medical student to ever intern at the World Health Organization Headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland. Dr. Millonig completed her surgical residency at Franciscan Foot and Ankle Institute in Federal Way, WA serving as chief resident her final year. She went on to complete her reconstructive fellowship specializing in complex limb deformity correction, lower extremity orthoplastics, and minimally invasive surgery at the Rubin Institute for Advanced Orthopedics International Center for Limb Lengthening in Baltimore, MD.

Dr. Millonig has served in medical service trips in several countries including the Uganda Clubfoot Care Project and Yucatan Crippled Children's Project. She has authored multiple articles in medical journals and textbooks. Dr. Millonig has served as a speaker and faculty for numerous international symposiums, earned several scholarly awards, and held multiple leadership positions in numerous national podiatric and public health committees with the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgery, American Public Health Association, and the American Podiatric Medical Association.



Christopher Bibbo, DO, DPM, FACS

Dr. Christopher Bibbo holds two medical degrees; a D.O. from the University of Medicine and Dentistry New Jersey/Rowan University School of Osteopathic Medicine and a D.P.M. from Temple University. Dr. Bibbo did his general surgery and orthopedic surgery residency at the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey, Rutgers New Jersey Medical School, followed by a Foot and Ankle Fellowship at the Miller Orthopaedic Clinic/OrthoCarolina in Charlotte, North Carolina. Dr. Bibbo completed a second fellowship in Reconstructive Plastic and Microsurgery in the Plastic Surgery Department at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia. Dr. Bibbo is board certified in Orthopaedic surgery and Foot & Ankle/Rearfoot Surgery.

Dr. Bibbo has been in practice for 15 years and was the Chief of the Foot and Ankle and Limb Preservation Service at the Marshfield Clinic in Wisconsin, and is now the Chief of Foot & Ankle Surgery at Sinai Hospital of Baltimore, where he specializes in Orthopaedic & Plastic Reconstructive/Microsurgery and Limb Salvage. Dr. Bibbo has over 100 publications and chapters and serves on the editorial board and acts as reviewer for numerous journals. #### Lisa Grant-McDonald, DPM, AACFAS

Dr. Lisa Grant was born and raised in Virginia Beach, VA. She graduated with a Bachelor's of Science from Old Dominion University with high honors. She graduated from Des Moines University with a Doctorate of Podiatric Medicine. ### Guido LaPorta, DPM, MS, FACFAS

Guido LaPorta, DPM is a board certified podiatric surgeon by the American Board of Foot and Ankle Surgery, the American Board of Podiatric Medicine and the American Academy of Podiatric Sports Medicine in which he was a founding member. He is a Fellow of the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgery, the American College of Foot Orthopedics and Medicine and the National Academies of Practice in Podiatry. Dr. LaPorta graduated from Temple University School of Podiatric Medicine and completed his Residency in Reconstructive Foot and Ankle Surgery at California Podiatry Hospital in San Francisco, CA. Ali Rahnama, DPM, AACFAS

Dr. Ali Rahnama, DPM, is a fellowship-trained foot and ankle surgeon affiliated with MedStar Washington Hospital Center and MedStar Georgetown University Hospital, and is an Assistant Professor at the Georgetown University School of Medicine. Dr. Rahnama sees patients for all conditions of the foot and ankle, with a special focus on traumatic and reconstructive surgery as well as minimally invasive and arthroscopic surgery for the treatment of athletic injuries. Dr. Rahnama also treats and specializes in diabetic Charcot reconstruction of the lower extremity.

Dr. Rahnama completed his medical schooling at Temple University School of Podiatric Medicine before completing a three-year surgical residency in foot and ankle surgery at the Wayne State University/Detroit Medical Center and the Children's Hospital of Michigan. He then completed a one-year specialty fellowship in traumatic and reconstructive foot and ankle surgery with The Southeast Permanente Medical Group, Inc. in Atlanta, where he performed more than 1,000 surgical procedures.



Dalton Ryba, DPM, FACFAS
